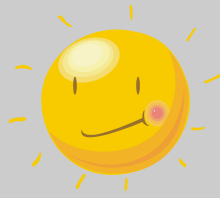

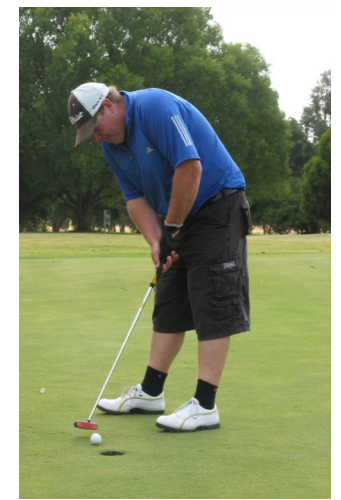

Preview
